# Worship Update

The Joint Discernment Team – in accordance with recommendations from the CDC, ELCA Churchwide Office, and NEPA Synod Office, and in keeping current with the latest statistical information provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Health, has offered the following recommendations to each of the five church councils with specific regards to indoor in-person worship gatherings:

• It is recommended that we continue to participate in online Zoom worship services through the end of August and avoid any indoor worship gatherings until such time as infection and vaccination rates are improved.

This recommendation will be revisited by the Discernment Team in May to see where things stand regarding infection and vaccination rates. Please note that the above recommendations will be modified accordingly if infection rates decline significantly and vaccination rates increase significantly by the time of the May meeting.

• It is recommended that as infection and vaccination rates allow, the five churches hold three joint outdoor Saturday evening worship services with Communion at Robeson Lutheran Church, 3520 Plow Road, Mohnton, PA 19540. These will be in addition to our weekly Sunday worship on Zoom.
